A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD AND THE CEO

PERSPECTIVES ON FRATERNALISM





Dear KSKJ Life Members.

As we approach our 39th National Convention this fall, and our 125th Anniversary in 2019, we have much to be excited about as an organization! We wanted to share some highlights with you, as well as some next steps that we can take together to promote KSKJ Life and fraternalism.

- KSKJ Life assets are growing we surpassed HALF A BILLION at the end of 2017 for the first time in our history! In 2007, we were at \$110M in assets. This is an astonishing increase of 458% in assets over the past ten years and is unprecedented growth in the fraternal insurance industry! This growth continues to occur as a result of much careful planning and strategic leadership by our current and previous Board members and Executive team at the home office, forward-thinking Convention delegates, strong agent field force, and committed lodge officers.
 - Our asset size and growth is a critical component of our continued success and survival. As a point of reference, in 2000 there were almost 100 fraternal organizations in the US and Canada. In 2015, that number was down to 70. KSKJ Life is one of only 15 of these societies with assets over \$500M. In addition to

survival, our asset size and success allows us to do business with preferred vendors – actuaries, reinsurance companies, etc. – that are not accessible to smaller societies.

- Membership is growing In the last 10 years, we have increased membership by 45% – putting us at over 40,000 life and annuity members in 2018!
- We have dedicated and committed lodge leaders across the country!
- · Robust Lodge activity:
 - Matching Funds Program In 2017 alone, KSKJ Life contributed over \$36,000 in charitable donations. Twenty-nine lodges held events – and ten lodges held a second event. In collaboration with other non-profit groups and charities, the total amount raised at these events in 2017 amounted to over \$705,000! In collaboration with

other non-profit groups and charities, over \$3.5 million has been donated through this program since its inception in 1994.

- In addition to the Matching Funds program, over \$30,000 was donated in 2017 as charitable giving with donations from members, agents, the Charitable Giving award, and home office matching for programs like the Supporting Soldier's campaign and Hurricane relief.
- Since 2010, members have contributed over 80,000 volunteer hours.
- In 2017 alone, over 165 lodge events were held – charitable, volunteer, and social - with \$38,000 distributed to lodges in support of their activities.
- Member Benefits:
 - Our most important benefit is the death benefit on insurance and annuity policies. In 2017, we paid out over \$13,000,000.
 - In recent years, we have added benefits in:
 - -PerkSpot discount purchasing program
 - -American Hearing Benefits program
 - -Transformed the Scholarship program to the Educational Grant that is available as a member benefit to all eligible members.
 - -Disbursed over \$53,000 in Educational Grants in 2017 alone; \$380,000 in Grants since 2015.
- We will be holding our 8th Young Adult Leadership Conference in August 2018 in conjunction with the National Convention. Nine delegates at the 2014 Convention had attended a Leadership Conference in the past, and many more have served as lodge officers. We're proud of this program and how it has contributed to the engagement of our young adults!
- Establishment of our new Fraternal Advisory Committee, composed of the Fraternal Coordinator of each lodge, which gives direct access and representation for every lodge
- Accomplished and forward-thinking Board of Directors
- Successful internal appointment of new CEO, Tony Mravle Jr, ensuring stability and continuity of our fraternal mission and identity, as well as business and home office operations, as required

by the State of Illinois and National Association of Insurance Commissioners

- Supportive, educated and professional home office staff, with an innovative and experienced leadership team with over 100 years of combined experience in the fraternal life insurance industry
- Increased fraternal support from the home office:
- Promotion of April Sleyko to Director of Marketing and Fraternal Services and addition to the home office Executive Committee to maintain a formal fraternal presence on the executive leadership team at KSKJ Life.
- New home office hire in March 2018 in Cathi Davis, Fraternal Communications Coordinator.
- Transitioned MaryLou Stefanick and Andrea Ostrowski into new Fraternal Engagement Coordinator positions, overseen from the home office, to continue national level fraternal programs, such as athletics and the Young Adult Leadership Conference, and to help us expand our support of lodge officers and presence at events.
- Lodge Operations in recent years, we have:
- Streamlined lodge funding and the reimbursement process
- Updated the lodge officer handbook
- Held training sessions for lodge officers

In 2018, we will be launching a new lodge officer website portal that will make lodge administration and communication easier.

- New technologies planning to launch a new web portal by early 2019 that will give members access to their KSKJ Life policies online
- Strong financial products and a commitment to expansion in 2018
- Exceptional general agents and agents
- Excellent external partners in legal, marketing, and technology

In February 2018, we conducted a survey to all lodge officers and hosted conference calls for Lodge Presidents and Secretaries, and another for Lodge Fraternal Coordinators, to connect and solicit feedback to see what kind of support is needed, as well as ideas about our new Fraternal Advisory Committee initiative.

As a result of the recent survey and conference calls, we received a lot of good responses – excitement and appreciation for KSKJ Life and where we are headed as an organization, some helpful ideas and suggestions, and examples of some successful programs that lodges are running.

We also heard an overwhelmingly common concern from almost every lodge – challenges with participation, particularly with meeting attendance and people willing to serve in leadership positions. Group social activity participation has been declining for many years.

We wanted to share some thoughts with you on this topic and some steps that we can take – together - to address this concern.

- Not only is member participation and leadership a common concern for us, but for all membership organizations. We hear the same concern from other fraternals in particular.
- People are busier now than in previous generations. Grandparents are working beyond normal retirement age and helping raise their grandchildren. If there are two parents in the home, both are working, and many times more than one job.
- Kids have challenging academics, multiple sports and musical interests, and jobs when they are old enough. The role of electronics is also significant, with many people spending "free time" on their phones, tablets, etc. on social platforms or gaming. It is very difficult to carve out "extra" time for anything, much less coordinate everyone's schedules.
- In most cases we are more spread out now.
 Lodge members live in different neighborhoods, cities, and states from each other, attending different schools and churches.

Not surprisingly, current national volunteer trends tend to be "episodic" – meaning that people enjoy volunteering, but are more likely to help with a last-minute activity for a smaller window of time (say an hour or so) than to make a long-term commitment.

If we look at these trends compared to our traditional model of lodge operations, we can easily see the disconnect and some of the reasons for our challenges with participation and engagement. In addition, it is not accurate or helpful to blame someone – it is not anyone's "fault" that it is difficult to engage people in lodge leadership and participation.

BUT THERE IS HOPE!

These same volunteering trends suggest that the younger generations are very active in volunteering and charitable community events. You may have also noticed a surge in things like ancestry and DNA testing to help people "find out who they are." Other trends are suggesting that younger generations in particular are looking to connect with something "real" and to discover their roots, wanting to know who they are and their uniqueness within the diversity of the world.

While there won't be an easy, magical way to increase our member participation, the important thing to realize is that there is the possibility of getting people engaged, particularly younger people. It is helpful for us to recognize the societal trends mentioned above to understand and accept the current realities of the world today. However, it is equally important for us to have a shared determination to work together and identify the things that we CAN do to find and recruit like-minded people, expanding and paying forward the mission and legacy of our great organization.

The more we collaborate and support each other, the more we will be able to share ideas and successes that might be able to be duplicated elsewhere. The recent lodge officer survey and conference calls are continued efforts in this regard, and we will continue to develop our new Fraternal Advisory Committee. We will also continue this conversation with workshops at the National Convention in August as well. It stands to reason that while there may be ways to increase our effectiveness with local community building, we would also do well to consider innovative new ways of engaging our membership digitally and remotely.

We greatly value and appreciate each and every one of our members, and our commitment to you will never waiver. We will continue to provide opportunities to make a difference in our communities. And, most importantly, we are committed to being here for you now and in the future.

A LOOK BACK.....THE 15TH KSKJ LIFE NATIONAL CONVENTION

The year was 1923...The first home game at the original Yankee Stadium was played between the Yankees and the Red Sox. The very first issue of Time Magazine was published, and the world's first portable radio was developed in the US.

It was also the year of the 15th KSKJ Life National Convention which was held in Cleveland, Ohio. Present and seated at the convention were 20 executive officers and 177 delegates. The assets of the organization as of June 30, 1923 were announced to be \$1,073,909. There were 13,439 adult members and 7,463 juvenile members.

This was the convention which introduced the Twenty Payment Life Insurance. With this decision, KSKJ was accorded the honor of becoming the first Slovene fraternal benefit society to offer its members both the 20-Year Payment Life Insurance as well as Whole Life Insurance. Also, KSKJ became the first among Slovene fraternal benefit societies to establish a Special Benefit Fund to assist disabled members who had attained 70 years of age.

Because women's rights were allowed by the decision of the 1920 convention, the first of many women delegates were present at this convention. Four women delegates attended sessions from Newburgh, Ohio: Helen Mally, Josephine Menart, Frances Debevec and Frances Zulich.

COLORADO GOVERNOR ISSUES PROCLAMATION FOR 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF SLOVENIA-COLORADO PARTNERSHIP

The following is an excerpt from a press release written by Maj. Darin Overstreet, Colorado National Guard.

CENTENNIAL, Colo. – Colorado Gov. John Hickenlooper issued a proclamation for April 3, 2018, as the 25th anniversary of the State Partnership between the Republic of Slovenia's Armed Forces and the Colorado National Guard Day.

"I'm proud of what Slovenia and Colorado have achieved over the past 25 years of partnership," Hickenlooper said. "Slovenia and Colorado have built a strong friendship around our shared mountain and rural cultures, and this helps keep our state, nation and world safe."

The SAF, the State of Colorado, and the U.S. military share a heritage of mountain warfare that dates to World War II.

The SPP relationship came into being when U.S. European Command employed the National Guard to assist nations in Central and Eastern Europe to prepare for NATO membership.

Fortunately for St. Mary #79 and the Midwest Veterans Closet, things went better than planned for the much-anticipated joint project.

On Saturday, March 10, St. Mary held its annual No-Tap "Pins for a Purpose" Bowling event, Matching Funds Prize Raffle, and toiletries drive. This year's charity recipient was Midwest Veterans Closet – Impacting Veterans Lives, Inc. located in neighboring, North Chicago, IL.

Guests filled Bertrand Bowling Lanes, far beyond the typical Saturday night in full support of St. Mary KSKJ Life #79 Matching Funds Event. Just under 130 bowlers took to the lanes and took part in the bowling and pizza festivities. More than 50 spectators cheered them on, sampled Slovenian cuisine, and bought raffle tickets for a chance to win Slovenian cultural specialties such as krvavica, Slovensko klobasa, Slovensko vino, Laško pivo, POTICA, Slovenia's own Flaška, and Slovenian Vodka. St. Mary selected to partner with the Midwest Veterans Closet, which is a Rapid Response charity taking the lead in Impacting Veterans Lives by providing weather appropriate clothing, household items, shoes and boots, linens, bedding, food from our Food and Nutrition Resource Center, and furniture to over 400 active military, veterans, and families per month. This partnership proved to be a perfect match, with the largest crowd ever coming out to support our annual fundraiser.

Just under 50 raffle prizes, valued at \$50.00-\$100.00 were generously donated by our lodge, our members, and the many loyal supporters of the Veterans Closet. St. Mary member Debbie Slater worked tirelessly coordinating the raffle, and newly elected lodge Fraternal Activity Coordinator Lori Mivshek managed the enthusiastic crowd of bowlers. Veterans Closet President Mary Carmody, dressed in her narodna noša (Slovenian Costume), had a very big impact on the night's success by using her resources to: 1) advertise the event, 2) solicit donations and 3) bring bowlers and spectators to the event. She also delighted the crowd by sharing her proud Slovenian culture.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

Lodge #169's Spiritual Advisor, Rev. John Kumse, made national headlines during the Christmas season...but for something quite scary rather than joyful. Fr. Kumse was attacked by two teenage boys just yards away from the rectory of St. Mary the Assumption Church in Cleveland's South Collinwood neighborhood. But this act of violence has only strengthened the church's congregation and gives us all a lesson in leadership.

The following is an excerpt from an article written by Phillip Morris of "The Plain Dealer":

Kumse attended a juvenile court hearing in March where his attackers were bound over to adult court. The 16-year-old boys now face numerous charges, including attempted murder, aggravated robbery and kidnapping.

The hearing was the first time that Kumse saw his alleged assailants since the incident. He said the hearing left him with a sense of sadness as well as an evolving perspective.

"I couldn't help but feel terrible for the young men. They've wasted their lives -- and for what? Their faces showed me the true nature of the poverty our society is up against."

After the attack Kumse, 65, said he worried how his

parishioners would react. He wondered whether his mostly Slovenian congregants, many of whom drive in from the suburbs, would have second thoughts about the inner-city parish....So far, those fears and worries have been largely unfounded. Rather than diminished church attendance or participation in parish events, Kumse says the attack has had no effect on those who call St. Marys their home. The incident has actually served to energize some.

"It was almost like an act of defiance. It was like the congregation was making a statement that it isn't giving up on the church or the neighborhood. More than half of the congregation is composed of first- or second-generation immigrants. They've seen and endured a lot. There's a certain toughness to the folks who belong to our parish," said Kumse with a chuckle.

"We can build, grow and sustain nice things in the inner-city. We just have to find the will and commitment to make it happen," Kumse said.

Kumse's devotion to his parish, his neighborhood and the city of Cleveland offers a compelling lesson in leadership.
