ST. VITUS PARISH: 125TH ANNIVERSARY

Wow! That is the only word to describe what happened on Sept. 30, 2018 when St. Vitus Parish officially observed the 125th Year Anniversary of the founding (1893-2018) with three special events.

The day began when The Most Reverend Nelson Perez, Bishop, Diocese of Cleveland, walked over to Joseph House of Cleveland, Inc., 6108 St. Clair Avenue, to bless and dedicate this newly remodeled site for the clothing distribution ministry of JHCI at 9:30AM. Bishop Nelson was warmly greeted by approximately 35 people. An additional mission of JHCI is to resettle incoming immigrants to Cleveland. Clergy, religious, St. Vitus Catholic War Veterans Post 1655, Knights of Columbus, individuals in Slovenian narodne nose, and members of the parish pastoral and finance council members gathered by the entrance of St. Vitus Village where they would process into the entrance of St. Vitus Church. There were over 70 people in the Slovenian narodne nose. Solemn Mass began at 11:00AM with exceptional singing of 50 + choir members of the two parish choirs plus four-string and four wind musicians for the Liturgy. The entrance hymn was "Jubileo Deo," astonishing the 650 + congregants.

The primary theme of Bishop Perez's homily was how faith and culture are connected and that one cannot be separated from the other. The singing of the combined choirs, under the direction of John F. Srsen*, was phenomenal. Songs were sung in English, Latin and Slovenian. The renovated church pipe organ was excellently played by William Patrick. The Solemn Mass concluded around 12:25PM with a group photograph taken of all in the Processional in the front of the church. Over 400 people arrived at Slovenian National Home, 6417 St. Clair Avenue, for the formal banquet and program. Mr. Frank Zitko*, president, St. Vitus Alumni, was introduced as the Master of Ceremony at 1:15PM. Rev. Greg Neuzil was called forward to offer an opening prayer for the banquet.

Dinner was promptly served by Joe Tavcar*, Erika Kurbos* and staff, with all refreshments already served on each of the 40+ tables. The grand finale was a specifically baked torte on each table, prepared by Sophie Mazi* and staff. As a token of appreciation, all attendees were presented a specially made glass cup with the 125th Year Anniversary logo on the cup designed in a blue color. The Larry "Patch" Paciorek Combo provided dinner music and entertainment. Fantje Na Vasi, a men's a cappella singing choir, provided two songs in Slovenian. Tom Gorensek* and John F. Srsen then gave their speeches, respectively in Slovenian and English, expressing their own unique perspective on what it means to be a parishioner. Frank Zitko* called on Dick Russ*, guest speaker, who gave a dynamic speech on faith, culture, the meaning of being involved in a parish and the broader community. Thank you, Tom, John and Dick, for your moving speeches.

Maria Lees, Greg Plassard and Ed Cup*, representatives from the parish pastoral and finance councils, came forward and presented Rev. Boznar with a gift from parishioners as a token of gratitude for being pastor at St. Vitus since 1979. The gift was an original oil portrait of Rev. Boznar with his entire family on the occasion of the 40th Year Wedding Anniversary of his parents.

The three events of the parish 125th Year Anniversary did not occur not occur without extensive planning and dedication by the following individuals: Rev. 5 SIGNS YOU NEED TO UP YOUR LIFE INSURANCE COVERAGE

Depending on the type of life insurance policy you have, you could be covered anywhere from a few years to the rest of your life, depending on if you have term or permanent whole life insurance. But if you've had a policy for a while, it might no longer be enough.

Two of the top five reasons people get life insurance is to cover mortgage debt and to pay for home expenses, according to the 2018 Insurance Barometer Study by Life Happens and LIMRA. If you have a family, the last thing you want is for them to be forced out of their home because they can't keep up with the payments. So, if you just bought your first home or a new home with a bigger mortgage, make sure you have enough coverage to at least make the monthly payments.

3. Your income has increased dramatically. Two-thirds of people who own life insurance bought it to replace lost income if they were to pass away, according to the same Barometer Study. If you've recently gotten a significant raise or your income has increased steadily since you last bought insurance, check to make sure your insurance coverage is still enough to replace it.

4. Your lifestyle has changed. While income increases often come with lifestyle changes, it's also possible to get a lifestyle upgrade after you've paid off debt or improved your cash flow in some other way. If you notice that you've been spending more per month than you were a year or two ago, your current life insurance policy may leave a gap between its coverage and your loved ones' needs.

5. You're thinking about your estate planning. Another top-five reason people get life insurance is to transfer wealth or leave an inheritance. As you get older, you may start thinking more about what kind of legacy you want to leave behind.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: LACEY VIANO SPENDS SEMESTER ABROAD IN SLOVENIA

This past summer, Lacey Viano from Lodge #108 in Joliet, Illinois had the opportunity to visit Slovenia for the very first time. Each year, the American Slovenian Education Foundation (ASEF) provides financial and educational support to students through their fellowship program. The purpose of the fellowship is to strengthen exchange between Slovenia and the rest of the world with the objective of giving talented students, preferably of Slovenian background, the ability to visit Slovenia while also gaining professional/academic experience.



Lacey visited other European landmarks, such as Saint Mark's Basilica (the cathedral church of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Venice, northern Italy).

"I actually found out about the trip through a newsletter from KSKJ Life," Lacey explained. "I had never left the country before, but my family is of Slovenian descent - my grandmother actually came over from there - so that place has a special meaning to me." During her two month stay, Lacey attended the University of Ljubljana to study food science and nutrition with Dr. Tanja Pajk, an assistant professor in the Biotechnical Faculty. Lacey's undergrad at Eastern Illinois University consisted of nutrition of dietetics, food science, medical nutrition therapy, and many community nutrition projects, so working with Dr. Tanja Pajk was a fantastic learning experience for Lacey. "I assisted with research and completed many different experiments," Lacey recalled. "It was eye-opening being exposed to such advanced food science technology, as Slovenia has. The members of the Biotechnical Faculty welcomed me with open arms and did everything possible to help me gain as much as I could from the program."

In her free time, Lacey was excited to experience the culture of Slovenia and reconnect with some of her distant family as well as learn about her grandparents through them. "My family was extremely welcoming and friendly, and just extended the warmest hospitality towards me," Lacey said. "The culture there is amazing. There's a strong sense of family and it's very laidback. They are very dedicated to conservation, nature and fresh foods."

Lacey especially relished exploring all the natural beauty Slovenia has to offer. "I made a good friend there and we did a lot of outdoor activities, such as mountain climbing, canyoning, going to the sea, hiking. Slovenia is just a breathtaking country." A few other favorite memories included attending outdoor concerts, the Odprta Kuhna (Open Kitchen Market), walking around the City Centre, biking through the park, and chatting with friends at small coffee shops. Committed to making the most out of her first trip outside of the United States, Lacey also dedicated some time traveling to other cities close by, such as Venice and Vienna in Italy and Budapest, Hungary.
