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A MESSAGE FROM KSKJ LIFE'S CHAIR, NATIONAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS **KSKJ LIFE 39TH NATIONAL CONVENTION**



For 124 Years, representative delegates from throughout the country have been coming together at KSKJ Life national conventions to set the course and future direction of our Fraternal Benefit Society. The 39th National Convention was recently held in Chicago

and did just that. Delegates elected by their local lodges made changes and updates to the By-laws, voted on several resolutions, shared numerous recommendations from the standing committees, and elected a new Board of Directors to lead KSKJ Life for the next 4 years.

This convention was preceded by the Young Adult Leadership Conference (YALC). Andrea Ostrowski, KSKJ Life National Activities Director. led a brilliant group of enthusiastic young individuals on a journey of preparation for future leadership in KSKJ. An unplanned guest from the Republic of Slovenia, Tone Slak, who just weeks earlier retired from his post in Brussels at the Slovenian Mission to NATO, spoke to the YALC about his work and the state of the international situation in Slovenian and Europe. He stopped at the hotel to visit as he was touring the USA. Tone, who served as a Slovenian diplomat for many years, is a good friend and a cousin to former astronaut Dr. Ron Sega.

A highlight from the YALC was the fundraiser they chose to do as a part of their leadership conference. Using celebration pictures as one of the ways to raise funds from the delegates, they made over a \$1,000 that was matched with an additional \$1,000 from KSKJ Life. Those proceeds were donated to a local charity. Following their event, the young leaders attended the convention and assisted as interns and runners during meetings.

The beginning of the National Convention is always a very solemn event, with the traditional opening prayer followed by the young adult leaders processing into the convention hall carrying flags from each of the states where we do business. After placing them at the podium, the American flag and Slovenian flags are then followed with the playing of the National Anthems of both countries. It is quite a moving affair.

As part of the opening ceremonies, it is customary for the largest lodge in KSKJ Life to present the "Golden Gavel" to be used during the proceedings. For the first time in many conventions, a different lodge had that honor. Bob Lokar, President of lodge #50 Blessed Virgin in Pennsylvania, presented the gravel for use at this convention.

John Vidmar, Honorary Consul for Illinois for the Republic of Slovenia, welcomed the delegation and shared greetings from the Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia and Ambassador Stanislav Vidovic and from Consulate General, Andrej Gregor Rode. Also, greetings were read from Honorary Consul of Slovenian in Pennsylvania, Petra Bracko Mitchell. Phil Hrvatin, Vice Chair read several other greetings received from Bruce Rauner, Governor of Illinois; Mayor Brad Stephens from the Village of Rosemont; Pat McGuire, Illinois State Senator and Lawrence "Larry" M. Walsh, Jr. Illinois State Representative.

Part of being prepared to make decisions that impact our fraternal society is knowing important and key facts about the business. To ensure the delegation understood the issues, several guest speakers made special presentations. Starting out the first morning session, Father Richard Gielow C.M., our Spiritual Advisor, and his twin brother priest, Father Robert Gielow C.M., did a presentation on mission and tradition. Paul Kaiser, the Director of Agent Sales at KSKJ Life, reviewed KSKJ Life products and how they fulfill our mission. Kathy Lovati, Manager of Agent Sales, introduced the 125th Anniversary "Friends and Family Campaign" that they are launching. Joe Annotti, President and CEO of the American Fraternal Alliance AFA, provided a very comprehensive overview of the Fraternal industry and new branding initiatives. Brad Simanek, our Actuarial Consultant with Griffith, Ballard and Company did a presentation on financial stability and industry benchmarks. He talked about, "How do we make money and where does it go?" Closing out the presentations, Chris Nowotarski, our Attorney and convention parliamentarian, discussed regulatory compliance and governance. These are some very knowledgeable leaders in the field of fraternalism and a definite asset for KSKJ Life to have access to these top professionals.

We introduced some innovative changes to the convention that have not been done previously. The seating for this convention was done by birth dates, which was a new and totally different approach designed to encourage delegates to become more acquainted with others from various areas of our membership. In the past, everyone sat together by lodges, where they rarely had the opportunity to meet others outside their own circles. This idea was well received, and the delegate feedback showed they supported the change. As a result, we did have to sing "Happy Birthday" more than once!

Delegates responded to a variety of issues regarding membership, our official newspaper "The Voice," lodge participation, etc. The compilation of these survey results will be used by the newly seated Board of Directors to update and develop our strategic initiatives.

When meetings were not in session, delegates and guests had a nice selection of items of interest to view. Pictures that captured yesterday have a specific way of enhancing an event when members and history are featured.

KSKJ LIFE NATIONAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

...AND SO MUCH MORE

Under bright sunny skies on a warm Saturday afternoon in June, the 5th annual KSKJ Life Golf Tournament teed off in Waukegan, IL. The event, which had 20 foursomes participate, was another success story both on and off the course. About 8 weeks ago, we completed our 5th KSKJ Life National Golf Tournament, and the good news continued. With a focus on Charitable Giving, we reached out to our friends at the Midwest Veterans Closet, asking how we could help them out. Their

To fully capture what the National Golf Tournament has meant, I need to take you back to 2013 when the idea was originally presented to the Board of Directors, asking them to financially support a National Golf Tournament for our 120th anniversary in 2014. My vision for the tournament would not only be a fun, athletic event, but also an opportunity to raise funds for our National Scholarship Program. Thanks to our generous members, lodges, and businesses, we raised over \$4,220.00 for the Scholarship Fund at that first tournament.

With this success, the National Golf Tournament was officially added to our Fraternal Calendar. In 2015, when KSKJ Life introduced the Charitable Giving Award, we took this tournament to the next level by adding a charitable element, asking golfers to bring granola bars to the course. That year, the golf tournament raised \$2,390.00 for the Scholarship Fund, and over 500 granola bars were collected and given to the Holy Family food pantry and used at children's summer programs.

The 2016 Golf Tournament followed suit. Keeping the community in mind, golfers were encouraged to bring boxes of instant oatmeal to the course for the St. Anastasia Food Pantry for distribution to children who often go to school without breakfast. Thanks to our generous golfers, we also raised \$3,280.00 for the Scholarship Fund.

The 2017 tournament was our biggest turnout and our biggest success story thus far. For the first time, we reached our capacity with 120 very generous golfers. At the end of the day, we raised \$3,975.00 for the Scholarship Fund, raised over \$1,000.00 for the Midwest Veterans Closet through contests on the course, and also collected nearly 500 new and gently used clothing items for them. About 8 weeks ago, we completed our 5th KSKJ Life National Golf Tournament, and the good news continued. With a focus on Charitable Giving, we reached out to our friends at the Midwest Veterans Closet, asking how we could help them out. Their response was simple: "meals in a can". Sadly, many of the veterans do not have the means to cook for themselves, so the stews, chilis, chunky soups, etc. would be a great help to many. Thanks to our very generous supporters, over 225 meals were collected and \$200.00 in cash donations was collected. Through the tournament's fundraising efforts, we also raised \$3,500.00 for the KSKJ Scholarship Fund.

After chairing this tournament for the last 5 years, I have learned a lot about our KSKJ people:

1) THEY LIKE TO PLAY GOLF – (over 450 golfers have participated in this event)

2) THEY ARE EXTREMELY SUPPORTIVE OF OUR MISSION – (over 2,000 items for various local charities have been donated)

3) THEY ARE EXTREMELY GENEROUS –(almost 150 members, friends, lodges, businesses, etc. from across the U.S. have acted as hole sponsors, and the \$17,365.00 raised has provided \$1,000 Educational Grants to 17 of our students.)

To call our annual event a "Golf Tournament" is only telling part of the story. As you can see, it is so much more – it's social, it's charity, it's community, and it's fraternal—all under one big golf umbrella. Many thanks to the dedicated volunteers from St. Joseph #53 and St. Mary #79 that serve as the host city. Each year they graciously step forward to do one of the many tasks involved in running an event like this. "Teamwork makes the dream work!"

St. Vitus Parish, established as the first American Slovenian Roman Catholic parish in the state of Ohio and diocese of Cleveland, will officially observe its 125th Year Anniversary Jubilee on Sunday, September 30, 2018 with a Solemn Mass at 11:00 am with The Most reverend Nelson Perez, Bishop, diocese of Cleveland, as the principal celebrant and homilist.



St. Vitus Parish St. Vitus Parish was established in August 1893.

The Mass will be in St. Vitus Church, 6019 Lausche Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44103. A banquet will immediately follow at Slovenian National Home, 6417 St. Clair Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44103. Cost for the banquet is \$50 per person. Tables of eight-to-ten may be reserved. Mr. Dick Russ will be the principal guest speaker at the banquet. KSKJ Lodges St. Vitus #25 and Christ The King #226 have been associated and affiliated with St Vitus for many decades.*

Prior to the Solemn Mass, Bishop Perez will bless and dedicate the newly remodeled Joseph House of Cleveland Inc., at 6108 St. Clair Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44103. Blessing and dedication will occur at 9:30 am. Joseph House is 100 feet from St. Vitus Church.

JHCI now has 2,135 square feet of space to serve the expanding clothing needs for any immigrant in northeast Ohio, as well as residents in and around the St. Clair Avenue neighborhood. Joseph House has two primary missions: resettle incoming immigrants to Cleveland, Ohio, and a clothing distribution ministry. Over 113 refugees have been resettled and 1,300 refugees and 1,200 neighborhood residents have been served by the clothing distribution ministry (which is by appointment only). Remodeling occurred from November 2017 to May 2018. The remodeling cost was \$44,000, with an additional \$15,000 provided in labor or materials, and another \$10,000 for the operating needs of Joseph House. Joseph House has three city and one suburban Catholic parishes involved in these corporal works of mercy: Immaculate Conception, St. Paul Croatian, St. Vitus, and Divine

St. Vitus Parish was established in August 1893 by 23-year-old founding pastor, Rev. Vitus Hribar. The parish has had six pastors since 1893 with Rev. Joseph Boznar as the sixth and current pastor, serving since 1979. There are 650 registered parish households serving 1,015 people, with parishioners from Cleveland, Cuyahoga, and Lake Counties. The church ediface is a Byzantine-Lombard design with twin bell towers raising 110 feet and yellow Falston exterior brick. The original Holtkamp church pipe organ, with 1,500 pipes, was totally restored in 2009, along with the installation of a "Veterans Memorial Monument," to commemorate the 750 + parishioners who served during WWII, with 40 Veterans lost in action. The parish has senior ministry, food bank pantry, hot meal program, and Saturday Language School as part of its ministries, in addition to collaborating with JHCI. The parish operates a scholarship program that promotes Catholic education, grades K-to-16, to registered parish households with over \$2 million in grants disbursed since 1989. The parish initiated and constructed St. Vitus Village, a \$6 million independent senior living facility, across the street from the church in 2000 through its development corporation. The parish has and continues to lease its school and auditorium buildings since 2003 to St. Martin de Porres High School.
