A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD: A MEMORABLE DAY IN THE HISTORY OF KSKJ LIFE



The morning air was brisk, and it was overcast from the night's rain. It left us with pause that the day would be miserable filled with humidity and persistent drizzle. But no, somehow through "divine intervention" the sun peaked out and the Joliet, IL weather cooperated to

make it a perfect day for this unforgettable KSKJ Life event.

The blessing and dedication of our newest building on the KSKJ Life campus was an exciting occasion to showcase our 123-year-old Fraternal Benefit society. The events started on the evening of Thursday, April 27 with KSKJ Life hosting the monthly Joliet Region Chamber of Commerce & Industry "Business After Hours" reception for the Joliet Business community. While KSKJ Life received the Chamber's Financial Services award in 2014, this was an excellent opportunity to introduce the history and work of KSKJ Life to local business and industry leaders. The success of the event can be summarized by a remark from one business leader: "I have seen your building for years and had no idea what you were about. Finally, I now know what you do."

Friday, April 28 was the official Building Dedication, Ribbon Cutting and Blessing of the building by our Spiritual Advisor. An overflowing crowd of Slovenian dignitaries from around the Chicago area, local Lodge Officers, current and past members of the Financial and Fraternal boards, the Home Office staff and numerous guests attended the event. Father Richard Gielow, accompanied by his brother priest, Father Bob Gielow, read a prayer of blessing before walking through the facility with Holy Water and officially dedicating our new facility. Following the blessing, dignitaries were introduced and comments were made regarding the arduous journey to acquire this new addition to the KSKJ Life Home Office campus, which is the fourth building in our 123-year history. The event concluded with the official ribbon cutting ceremony in front of the facility, and both the Financial and Fraternal Boards alternated cutting the ribbon. At the conclusion, attendees received a complementary commemorative glass.

CELEBRATING LODGE ANNIVERSARIES: LODGE #171

St, Elizabeth Lodge #171 (Duluth, Minn.) was established on May 29, 1922 and accepted into the KSKJ on June 1, 1922. This Lodge had two formal organizers: Rev. Aloysius Pirnat and Frank Vesel. There were 11 Charter Members: Rev. Pirnat, Frank Bimpel, Victor Blazevic, Matt Belcic, Thomas Subic, Rudolph Gimpel, Mary Jancar, Josephine Blatnik, Anna Skulj, Lucille Jurkovich, Johanna Gimpel, and Agnes Skulj.

The First Officers were: Frank Gimpel, President; Frank Vesel, Financial Secretary; as well as Recording Secretary. Victor C. Blazevic, Treasurer and Lodge Representative; and Anton Cernich and Thomas Subic, Auditors. Frank Vesel, Secretary, became the Lodge's first delegate at the 1923 convention in Cleveland, OH.

The present-day activities include picnics, annual sleigh ride, bowling, bean bags, Singing Slovenes Ethnic and Cultural Entertainers, bus trips, a Christmas party for youth and adults, food and clothing drives, Minnesota Federation membership, Join Hands Day, and Matching Funds Projects.
