A MESSAGE FROM THE KSKI LIFE HOME OFFICE

CELEBRATING KSKI LIFE'S 125TH ANNIVERSARY



In April, KSKJ Life officially became 125 years young. During the following months, there have been celebrations happening all around the KSKJ Life community. On August 17th we held our official celebration in Joliet, home of our great Fraternal Benefit Society. The events began with mass at St. Joseph Church, one of the first Slovenian churches in

Joliet. Father Richard Gielow CM, our Spiritual leader, was the celebrant. Mass was con-celebrated by Father Metod Ogorevo from the Slovenian Catholic Center and Fr. Tim Andres, pastor of St. Joseph's Church. The beautiful celebration was enhanced by the "Zbor Spendov Singing Group" thanks to John Vidmar, Honorary Slovene Consul for Illinois and Mike Vidmar, former National Board member. Following mass, those attending were invited to visit the St. Joseph Museum with curators Ray and Annette Koncar from Lodge #143.

The celebration then moved to the Joliet Historical Museum where tours were provided. A dynamic 125th KSKJ Life Anniversary video that was produced by Andrea Ostrowski was shown.

The formal program included comments by the Board Chair and CEO Tony Mravle. A Certificate of Recognition was read from the Illinois House of Representatives that was sent by 86th District Representative Larry Walsh, Jr. State Senator Pat McGuire from Illinois District 43 spoke and made a presentation. Alenka Jerak, Consul General of the Republic of Slovenia, provided remarks and presented an official document to KSKJ Life from the country of Slovenia recognizing this great milestone.

Entertainment included a performance by "Slovenska Mladinska Skupina Marela Dance Troupe" followed by Music and Dancing by "Ray Koncar and the Boys."

A good time was had by all!

Grateful appreciation goes out to the Home Office team of Lauren Baltz, Cathi Davis, Christy Kelly and April Sleyko for organizing and coordinating this very successful event.

Below are some of my thoughts that I shared at the celebration about the vibrant history of KSKJ Life:

"Dreams are the fool's ideas of yesterday, that are commonplace today." Credited with that quote was Melvin Jones, who was born in 1879 and was the founder of the Lions Club International.

He very easily could have been talking about KSKJ Life.

In 1891, a young Slovenian Missionary priest, Fr. Francis Sustercic, came to America to serve the Slovenians in the community of Joliet, Illinois. Inspired by Monsignor Joseph Buh, who published the "American Slovenian," Father Sustercic had a dream of bringing together Slovenian immigrants from around the United States to form a common bond.

When the immigrants came to America from Eastern Europe, the Austrian Empire, and more precisely from the area of Yugoslavia known as Slovenia, they went wherever there was work; usually in steel mills, smelters, and mines. They settled in various cities in Illinois, Michigan, Montana, Minnesota, Colorado, Wisconsin, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Kansas. The work was hard and dangerous and there was no protection for the workers.

Fr. Francis Sustercic shared this dream with the new immigrants to America and convinced the representatives from most of these communities that his great vision to form one Fraternal Society would strengthen the ties of his fellow immigrants by offering material assistance and protection, as well as spiritual guidance. "In Unity there is Strength" or "V Slogi Je Moc!"

In 1894 his dream and vison came to fruition when 10 independent groups from across the country came together to establish the Grand Carnolian Slovenian Catholic Union or the KSKJ, Kranjska Slovenska Katoliška Jednota. Now we are KSKJ Life, the American Slovenian Catholic Union. Three of those original 10 groups are still in existence. They are St. Stephen Lodge # 1 in Chicago, St Joseph Lodge #2 in Joliet and St. Joseph Lodge #7 in Pueblo, CO.

Today, 125 years later KSKJ Life is celebrating the results of that dream and the great vision of a humble missionary priest.

Why was Joliet, Illinois initially chosen to be the home for KSKJ? In Marianne Wolf's book "Images of America Joliet" she identified, that in 1891, there were 73 Slovenian families living in Joliet, mostly between the Des Plaines River and Ruby Street.

In the early 1900's, Slovenians in Joliet operated 19 salons, 5 dry goods and grocery stores, 3 meat markets, 1 funeral parlor and 1 cigar manufacturer. In 1899 the first Slovenian newspaper in America "Amerikanski Slovenec" moved to Joliet, Illinois. Also, in 1904, the first Slovenian physician in the United States opened his office in Joliet. Quite a remarkable early presence of Slovenes in Joliet and the perfect place for our Home Office!

Over the years KSKJ Life continued to grow, and like most businesses of longevity, we experienced the roller coaster that is life; living through wars, depressions, prohibition and the continual challenges of this world. Yet through all this KSKJ Life not only survived, it thrived.

In 2014, KSKJ Life held our National Convention at Walt Disney World in Florida. We were told about an interesting anecdote that happened when Disney World first opened. It took many years to build Disney World and during that time Walt Disney passed away. At the Grand Opening, a group of VIPs' were touring the park. A visitor made a comment to one of the Disney executives doing the tour about what a marvelous place it was, and that it was a shame that Walt Disney never got to see it. The Disney executive replied, "Walt Disney did see it; that's why it's here."

I wonder if Fr. Francis Sustercic, the young missionary priest and our founders of KSKJ Life saw what we would look like today. Those pioneers were all great dreamers and true to their inspiration, they were never less than their dreams.

A famous President once said that "History is made by the Dreamers, not the Doubters."

Today is a great time in the history of KSKJ Life as we celebrate 125 years of our successful survival. So many great people made this year possible and to all of them, we will be forever grateful.

Thank you to all our KSKJ Life members and many friends as we celebrate this great milestone in our long journey!

SLOVENIAN DELEGATION VISITS PUEBLO COMMUNITY

A delegation of Slovenian dignitaries made a short visit to Pueblo on August 19 as part of their visit to Colorado to attend a National Guard convention in Denver, Colorado. The 15 visitors made a spectacular entrance to the city arriving in 3 Black Hawk Helicopters following an early morning visit to the High-Altitude Training center in Eagle Colorado. His Excellency Karl Erjavec, Slovenia's Minister of Defense led the delegation that included the new Chief of Defense, General Alenka Ermenc (the only female head of military in NATO). Slovenian Ambassador to the United States, His Excellency Stanislav Vidovic, Mr. Uros Krek, Deputy Secretary General/National Security Advisor to the President, as well as several other members of the Slovenian military. Also arriving with them was Major General Michael Low, The Adjutant General of Colorado and Major Edward Kim, Bilateral Affairs Officer at the US Embassy in Ljubljana.

In front of the Gorsich Center the visit was concluded with the delegation and Minister Erjavec planting a Linden tree and dedicating it as the official tree of Slovenia.

Overall, the visit was an impressive opportunity for Pueblo Slovenians to show case our community and the great contribution made by the early Slovenes to Colorado.

Below is the Address made by Minister Erjavec during his visit:

"Dear Mayor Gradisar, fellow Slovenians, Ladies and Gentlemen.

I am very glad to have this opportunity to visit you here in Pueblo, one of the towns with the biggest Slovenian communities in the United States. The first day of my visit here in Colorado has been marked with Slovenian colors. This morning, I had the opportunity to inaugurate a hayrack, kozolec, in Centennial, as a symbol of our friendship and cooperation with the Colorado National Guard.

Although Slovenia is bilaterally cooperating with Colorado for just 25 years, Slovenians have left a mark on Colorado for well over a century. You are living proof of it. Slovenian-Americans are crucial for Slovenia's relations with the United States, as you are connecting our two cultures in business, politics and culture.

At the same time, I would like to express my gratitude to the people of Colorado, who have so graciously accepted Slovenians in their communities so many years ago and continue to do so.

Seeing you all here today, I am very proud to see how well the Slovenian community is thriving in the United States. It is very heart-warming to see you are keeping the traditions of your ancestors alive. You are very important to Slovenia, as you are ambassadors of our culture abroad.

Thank you for your warm welcome, generous hospitality, and for making me feel at home.

KSKJ LIFE NATIONAL EVENT

If you had the opportunity to attend KSKJ Life's National Event on August 17th in Joliet and visit the St. Joseph's Museum between Mass and the event itself, you may have noticed a special KSKJ Life display in the main hallway. Lodge 143 members Ray and Annette Koncar, who are the curators of the museum, graciously assembled this special display. It tells the history of the Joliet Home Office buildings and includes actual newspaper clippings from celebrations such as KSKJ Day in 1948 which honored those KSKJ members who served their country in World Wars 1 and 2.
